Bus travel from the plains will be provided to Annual Conference (July 2-6) in Columbus, Ohio this summer! "The Plains" bus will leave Wichita, Kan. on July 1 with pick-up stops in McPherson, Kansas City, and Missouri as needed and will return to Wichita on July 7. On the evenings of July 1 and 6, the group will stop for overnight stays at Country Inn and Suites (breakfast included) in Effingham, Ill.

At Annual Conference, 25 rooms have been reserved for our group at Drury Inn,



just next door to the Convention Center. Cost for each room is \$70 per person double occupancy, payable at conference. This includes hot breakfast and a substantial food bar from 5:30-7:00pm.
